# Women's Crisis Center

Women's Crisis Center is a nonprofit social service agency committed to providing services to survivors of rape, domestic violence, and child sexual abuse. All of our services are free and confidential. We provide crisis intervention, counseling, and shelter for partner abuse survivors.

### **Mission Statement**

Women's Crisis Center is committed to advocating for the empowerment of adults and children who have survived domestic violence, sexual abuse or rape. We provide crisis intervention, counseling, and shelter for partner abuse survivors.

### Non-residential Programs 24 Hour Crisis Lines 800/928-3335 and 859-491-3335

Our walk-in offices serve non-residential clients, offering crisis intervention and group or individual counseling for survivors and those close to them.

Walk-in staff provides information on rape, domestic violence and sexual abuse, plus referrals to appropriate agencies. We provide advocacy and support for police interviews and court appearances. Advocates are on-call 24 hours a day, 365 days a year, to promote sensitive treatment of sexual assault survivors in local hospitals. We provide services to and address the effects language and cultural barriers have on survivors, direct assistance and services to human trafficking victims and people with disabilities. IDA program – assist clients in accessing available tax credits, financial educational classes, credit assistance and establishing Individual Development Account.

## **Residential Programs**

Our shelters provide safe, nurturing environments which help battered women regain their sense of self-worth and autonomy.

Professional staff provides individual counseling, advocacy and referrals including employment and housing. Group activities address single parenting, self-esteem, health and nutrition issues. Our *Job Readiness Program* helps residents acquire the necessary skills to conduct a job search and secure employment.

*Children's World* answers the special needs of our young residents with parent education, family assessments, supervised activities, field trips and counseling. Staff maintains contact with each child's home school until the student can return. A local school district delivers in-house instruction so sheltered children can continue their learning in a secure setting with a teacher who understands their situation.
